

## Coffman Welcomes Local Students to Washington

**(WASHINGTON)** — Rep. Mike Coffman (R-Aurora) welcomed Colorado high school students to Washington, D.C. this week as part of the National Rural Electric Youth Tour. Close to 1,500 students from towns and small cities across rural America spent a week in the nation's capital to learn about energy issues important to electric cooperatives, and about the federal legislative process.

Today, over 1.25 million Coloradans rely on co-ops to power their homes and businesses.
