Dear Mr. President:

As the United States approaches the fifteen-year anniversary of the September 11<sup>th</sup> terrorist attacks, I write to you to encourage the administration to declassify all the findings from the *Joint Inquiry into Intelligence Community Activities before and after the Terrorist Attacks of September 11, 2001*.

When the report was released to the public in 2002, one section, involving the results of an investigation into whether or not a foreign government was complicit in the al Qaeda directed terrorist attacks on the United States, remained classified and unavailable to the American people. Having read all 28 pages of the still classified chapter of the report, I strongly recommend the federal government declassify the report in its entirety and make it available to the American people. There is no reason to keep this information from the public.

As an administration that prides itself on transparency, your office has an obligation to share the full report with the American people. They deserve access to the full truth.
